California Poppy and Corydalis have been used traditionally to ease occasional spasms in smooth muscle, particularly for example, of the:

- uterus, thereby providing relief from discomfort associated with menstruation⁷
- bowel, thereby supporting healthy tone and reflex responses in the intestine^{2,8,10,11*}
